

A well-planned and executed Senior Project can formally demonstrate the skills you have learned during your K – 12 education and a fitting conclusion to your high school education. Through your select project, you will make use of an array of skills including reasoning, research, problem solving, human interaction, organization, time management, writing and public speaking. These same skills and abilities are what you will be expected to demonstrate as college students and/or employees.

KEEP IT SIMPLE... CHOOSING YOUR TOPIC OR FOCUS

Think about a specific area or industry that interests you the most. Consider what you are passionate about or what can hold your attention for long periods of time. Be prepared to direct this learning experience and take responsibility for it.

WAGS & PURRS... CONSIDER THE HUMANE SOCIETY OF TUOLUMNE COUNTY (HSOTC)

Since 1947, the HSOTC's, a no-kill, limited intake facility, mission is to find homes for abandoned, abused, and unwanted animals, promote humane education, and maintain a clean and safe environment for homeless animals awaiting adoption. Focusing your senior project around animals can have a huge impact on the lives of the homeless dogs and cats that enter our shelter every day. A purr from a shelter cat or a wagging tail from a homeless dog will touch your heart and bring you back for more. It's a rewarding experience knowing that you can make a difference in the lives of our four legged friends. A few examples of areas to consider include:

- 🐾 Apply for an animal-related grant
- 🐾 Champion a senior animal
- 🐾 Create a future animal sanctuary design
- 🐾 Cultivate an animal awareness campaign for community outreach.
- 🐾 Develop a fundraising event – i.e., concert-in-the-park, bowl-a-thon, ice cream social, dog walk, or 5K run.
- 🐾 Generate an Adopt-A-Pet Day
- 🐾 Implement a dog food round-up and kitty litter corral giving campaign
- 🐾 Produce a study on senior citizens and animals.
- 🐾 And more...
